This year's Conservative Political Action Conference, or CPAC, opens today. It will be the 41st such conference which over the years has grown from a small gathering of conservative activists to the single largest and most important conservative event of any year.

This year we expect more than 10,000 conservatives to show up for the three-day conference. They are coming from all over the country not just to hear the politicians and conservative leaders they don't get to see in person or question very often, but to meet in the halls and over coffee with fellow activists; to discuss different strategies and tactics, grade their political heroes and debate the issues they believe most important.

Ronald Reagan spoke at the first CPAC and at another seventeen as Governor, President and conservative activist. It was at our 1981 conference that he said he had chosen to come so soon after being sworn in as President because he was a firm believer in "dancing with those who bring you." A few years before, it was at CPAC that he had outlined his strong belief that to win the Republican Party had to march under a banner not of "pale pastels," but of "bright colors." Many of those in his audience that year marched with him and helped make it possible for him to come back as President.

Since then, CPAC has been a "can't miss" stop for conservative politicians, intellectuals and activists. It was the first out-of-studio event ever broadcast by C-SPAN and attracts journalists from all over the world who want to take the pulse of our conservative movement. I still remember our first conference following the election of Bill Clinton as President. The media was for perhaps the tenth time writing the obituary of the Republican Party and the conservative movement and reporters flocked to CPAC expecting to find us despondent and defeated. They came away realizing that the movement was alive, that we are driven not by party or politicians, but by ideas and our vision of a strong and free America.

They stopped writing us off that year, but tried again after the 2008 elections. They found the same optimism and energy at CPAC as they had before. Ours is a movement that isn't going away. Conservatives believe deeply in the values we share and are always looking forward to our next policy and political victories rather than backwards at the bumps in the road we expect as we work to realize our dreams.

2014 is the 50th anniversary of the American Conservative Union, which has hosted CPAC for the past 41 years. There are a lot of similarities today with our founding then. Conservatives had lost a difficult presidential race with our candidate Barry Goldwater but rather than give up, William F. Buckley and others summoned the strength to form ACU and formally declared that conservatism was here to stay in America. Win or lose. This weekend we will honor those who inspired our founding and embrace those who promise to carry the conservative torch for the next generations to come.

Join us this weekend at CPAC. You'll find it inspiring, informative and like those who've dropped by in past years, you'll be glad you did!

How CPAC has grown

The unique gathering for conservatives convenes this week

The first Conservative Political Action Conference, or CPAC, convened in Washington 41 years ago drawing a little more than 100 conservative activists from around the country who found themselves enthralled by a keynote address delivered by California's Republican governor, Ronald Reagan.

CPAC is a unique gathering. College and university conservatives attend because, for most of the year, many feel isolated, but for three days each year, they bask in the knowledge that they are not alone and that they are in fact part of a large and vibrant movement that could

Those attending this year's conference, like those who attended that first one, share a set of basic values. They believe in the importance of the individual and family in a free society choosing to

tionalism, while others are more than a little skeptical of what they see as adventurism. Some are free-traders and others wonder if American workers don't suffer from policies that sound good on paper but may not work so well in practice.

Their differences fascinate their opponents and the media. They disagree on immigration policy; on when, where and whether the nation should be willing to go to war, to what degree a conservative should be willing to trade liberty for security, on gay rights, abortion and whether an atheist or agnostic can be a "conservative." Some don't even like to be described as conservatives. One of their heroes, Friedrich Hayek, once wrote at length about why he objected to the term itself.

Over four decades, all of these differences have been argued by CPAC attendees as conservatives have worked to apply their values and principles to new challenges in a constantly changing world. In the '60s and early '70s, most conservatives would probably have described themselves as pro-choice. There were heated arguments at early CPACs as abortion was debated and as attitudes began to change. Eventually, a consensus was reached, and while there are still pro-choice conservatives within the movement, it would be fair to say that today most conservatives are pro-life.

A few years ago, the very idea of debating drug policy upset many attendees, though conservative leaders such as William F. Buckley Jr. disagreed with the day's consensus. There is no consensus today, but conservatives at CPAC and within the movement no longer shy away from the debate. The same can be said for issues such as criminal justice reform and what conservatives should demand of those who seek their votes.

Outsiders see these arguments as evidence of potential weakness. Conservatives see them as a reflection of the strength of a movement that comes together on essential values and in opposition to those who threaten those values without themselves becoming either hidebound or intolerant. They neither think nor march in lockstep. They may differ on strategy and tactics, but all of them share a vision of a society that Ronald Reagan liked to describe as a "shining city upon a hill," and all of them are striving to make it a reality.

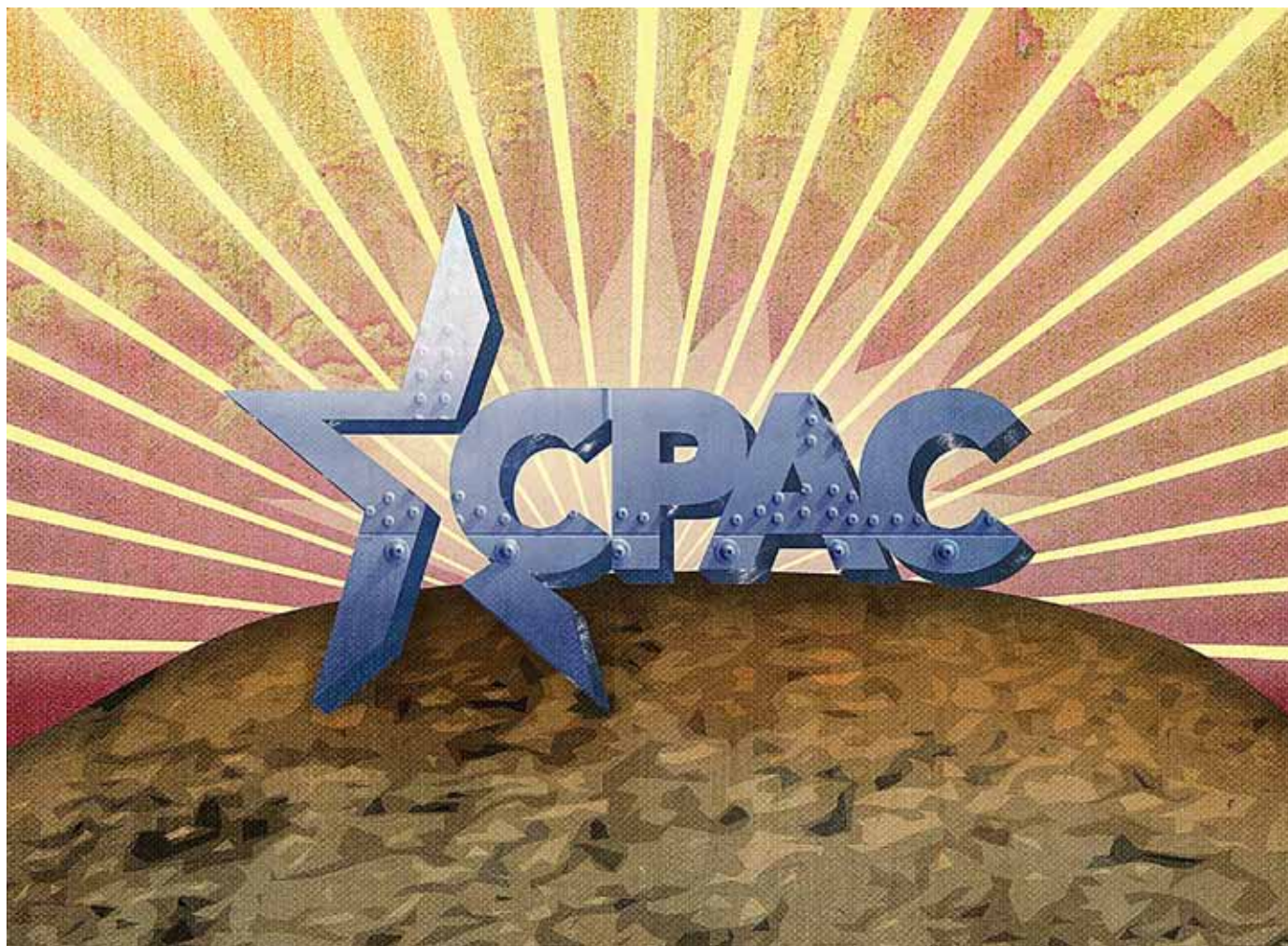

Since then, CPAC has grown to the event that will kick off this Thursday. Some of them will have attended every CPAC since that first one, but nearly half of them will be under 30, and more than 2,000 of them will be first-time attendees.

Those who come back year after year do so not just because during the three-day conference they get to hear and often meet leading conservative politicians, leaders and intellectuals, but because it is the one time each year that they get the

well decide the future of their country. They return to school reinvigorated and prepared to do their part to advance conservative ideas and policies, to work in the trenches for conservative politicians and, in many cases, to contemplate running for office themselves.

They also come to realize that the movement of which they are a part is neither monolithic nor incapable of adapting to the ever-changing public-policy challenges that confront conservatives. The conservative movement is not today and has never been the sort of ideological movement that one finds on the left, but a diverse coalition of free-marketers,

live with a respect for the law and for each other. They believe in free markets and in traditional norms enforced not through the offices of an all-powerful state, but by tradition and choice. They share a belief in the American Experiment and the need to maintain the vision of the Founders of a free people living in a federal system of limited government guaranteed by a constitution that has stood the test of time.

While sharing these values, they differ on specifics and on their focus. Some call themselves libertarians; others see themselves as religious conservatives. Some believe in an aggressive interna-

LET'S VOTE

A development of this kind will produce a confluence of new small businesses. Reliable economists point out that small businesses provide approximately 65% of all new jobs in the U. S.

Picture the U. S. as a country with low competing energy costs. Folks, it's there for the taking.

I believe American engineers can do virtually anything. In the past 10 years Americans and Canadians have discovered enough natural gas reserve to provide inexpensive and safe fuel for hundreds, if not thousands of years.

When the necessary facilities and distribution points have been completed, this country will have energy sources within its own borders and will no longer have to rely on countries in the Middle East or anywhere else.

There is another proven way to create new jobs and enrich our economy. That is to establish good trade relations with foreign nations. To do we should negotiate appropriate trade agreements.

Here is an example. It costs several times more to produce and transport natural gas in Eastern Europe, most of Asia and the Pacific Rim. Throughout the world good heads will continue to envy the U. S. and seriously want to develop their own natural gas or other energy sources to compete in a world where winning means producing and selling goods and services at a competitive price. If they do not have necessary resources within their own boundaries, they will have to buy from the U. S. or some other competing country.

Once entrepreneurs and engineers produce a new and lasting product and have obtained appropriate patents and other protective devices, buyers will be found on a worldwide basis. More jobs!

History tells us that few countries can outpace the U. S. when it comes to new discoveries, talents and abilities to design and produce products. **Many of these services and products have greatly improved the health, safety and wealth of millions and millions of men and women and thousands of institutions in every corner of the world.**

Let's return to our small but important part of the world. I believe that we have the knowledge, experience, willingness, and ability to design and initiate a new political and economic model. We must find leaders with vision and the ability to reverse our present course which can only steer us into a form of socialism which is largely present in Western Europe.

The United States has built the richest and most successful economy and produced the largest number of new ways of improving life. This, I believe, has been accomplished through the guidance, hopes and wishes of our forefathers who believed in a system which would provide each man with the ability to make his own choices.

This is known as capitalism. It is interesting to note that Winston Churchill once said, "The inherent voice of capitalism is the unequal sharing of the blessings. The inherent blessing of socialism is the equal sharing of misery."

I am confident that we do have men and women with character, strength, courage and guts to provide stepping stones for a new government which will in fact be a servant of the people and provide them with leadership and laws legislated only in the best interest of their constituents, as opposed to their own selfish interests or those of others.

If you have an ounce of doubt, you may remember some great pioneers. Thomas Edison, the Wright Brothers, Charles Lindbergh, or Franklin D. Roosevelt.

I include Roosevelt because he had the unique genius to find the very best men and women to reorganize and lead an ill-equipped and untrained nation to wage a history-changing war against Germany and the Axis powers, who might have carried our world into a second Middle-Age hell.

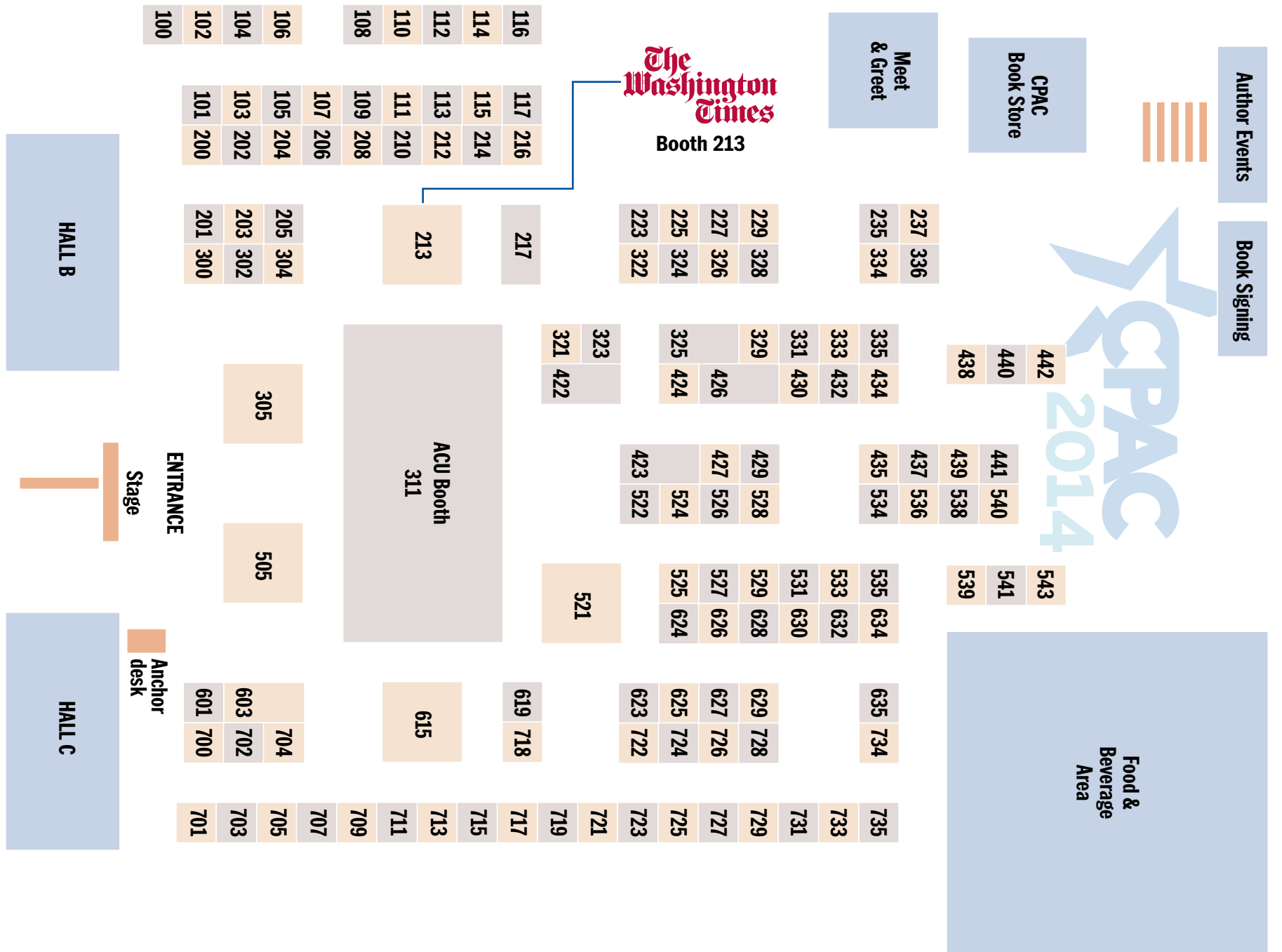

Lord God. It begins with the words: “The soul that sinneth, it shall die.”

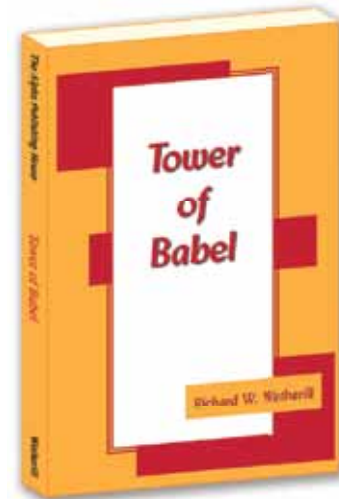

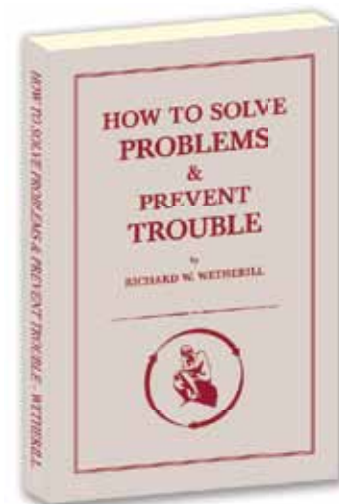

Words given to the ancient prophet Ezekiel seem appropriate now, “turn yourselves and live ye!”

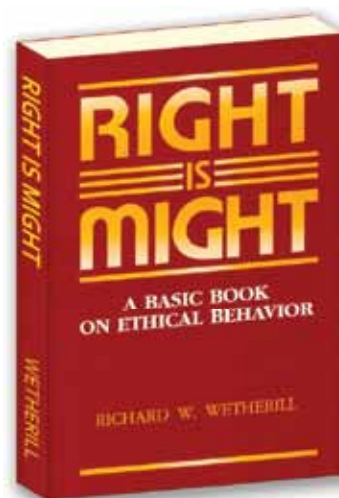
