

FAILURE TO OUST

Keeping illegal immigrants out of the U.S. is tough. Keeping them from coming back after deportation can be even tougher. The most-deported person from 2000 to 2015 was ousted 44 times. Here is a smattering of some repeat deportees and crimes they have been accused or convicted of committing.



Four deportations: Tommy Vladimir Alvarado-Ventura was accused last year of sexually assaulting a 2-year-old and stabbing two women in New York.



Five deportations: Jose Ines Garcia Zarate admitted to killing Kate Steinle in 2015. He was acquitted of murder but was convicted on gun charges.



Six deportations: Bonifacio Oseguera-Gonzalez admitted to a 2016 shooting that left three dead in Oregon.



Seven deportations: Ricardo Velasquez-Romero was arrested in December on charges of stabbing a 61-year-old man in the neck.



13 deportations: Sergio Jose Martinez was convicted last year of brutal assaults on two women in Oregon. A week earlier, he was released under Multnomah County's sanctuary policy.



17 deportations: Constantino Banda Acosta was charged in a hit-and-run crash last year that severely injured a 6-year-old boy on his way home from Disneyland.



19 deportations: Tomas Martinez-Maldonado was accused of raping a 13-year-old girl on a Greyhound bus in 2016.
